

International Human Rights Day Candle Light Vigil
In Solidarity with the USW Strike at Vale-Inco



Thursday, December 10th 6:00 pm Starting at the McClelland Arena in Copper Cliff Continuing at the Picket Line at the Vale-Inco Smelter

On December 10th, 1948 the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights outlining a set of inalienable rights that every person in the world should enjoy. Chief among them are economic human rights including the right to work and join trade unions (Article 23), the right to rest and leisure (Article 24) and the right to a decent standard of living (Article 25).

To commemorate International Human Rights Day, join the Sudbury District Labour Council for a candle light vigil on the picket line in support of the USW Strike at Vale-Inco.

Dues Structure Change

ATTENTION CAW MEMBERS AT OLGC - SLOTS AT SUDBURY DOWNS

With Mine Mill finally representing the members at OLG, dues structure must be the same as per our union constitution.

CAW NATIONAL CONSTITUTION

Minimum monthly dues will be equivalent to two hours 20 minutes straight time pay for all members who work 40 hours or more in a month. For those members who work less than 40 hours in a month the minimum monthly dues will be equivalent to one hour and 10 minutes straight time pay.

CAW -MINE MILL LOCAL 598 CONSTITUTION

Full time employees will be deducted on a bi-weekly basis, 1 hour and 15 minutes (at regular rate of pay).

Part time employees working less than 40 hours in a month, will be deducted 1 hour and 15 minutes per month. If hours are more than 40 hours in a month, then 2 hours and 30 minutes will be deducted per month.

All unionized member, full time and part time, will also be deducted .01 cent for every hour worked for solidarity fund.

This will be in effect immediately.

Human Rights

The Human Rights Department is responsible for coordinating human rights training, anti-racism work and other human rights struggles in the union and the community. The Human Rights Department can be contacted in confidence about human rights issues including harassment based on prohibited grounds. The Department holds regular CAW human rights conferences to educate and organize around equality and human rights issues.

Youth

The CAW youth project is about creating space for young people within the union to develop confidence, skills, and knowledge to participate actively in union life and play a role in the building of the union. The first national youth conference was held in May, 2000. This inspired young members in several local unions to create youth committees. Help with youth committees is available through the Education Department.

Article 31 Discipline

......When an employee is called to a meeting by the Employer where **discipline** or **discharge** will be imposed, the employee will have a Union Steward present. In the event of discipline, the interview iwllnot proceed until a Union Representative Is present and this provision is **mandatory**......
